<p>This proposal will replicate the Ventura County Crime Victims with Developmental Disabilities Project by modifying the two main elements of the Ventura Project: The Law Enforcement Protocol and the "Striving for Justice" Conference to address the unique needs of residents and service systems of Los Angeles County. An Inter-Agency Taskforce comprised of key stakeholders from criminal justice and consumer groups will convene to provide oversight to the replication and create a structure for sustaining a deliberate and effective commitment to improve access to justice for victims with developmental disabilities residing in Los Angeles County. This effort will further enhance work already in motion in Los Angeles County. This proposal will serve 10,500 consumers and 3,000 family members.</p>

<p>This program will provide life-planning workshops, counseling, and service referrals for aging parents and relatives caring for adult children//relatives with developmental disabilities in their homes. This program will conduct educational seminars and small workshops, provide one-on-one counseling and referral resources to assist 80 or more aging caregivers. This program will collaborate with the San Diego Regional Center and other Social Service Agencies, in order to locate aging caregivers needing this service. Additionally will conduct quarterly informational seminars to sign up families to complete a series of six sessions with life-planning expert/trainers, fill out a life-planning workbook, and receive one-on-one (for HIPPA purposes), and referral resources for their action plans. The workbook and their letter of intent will outline their own care and end-of-life wishes as well as plans for the residential security, care and wishes of their disabled family member. Person-centered planning and involvement of the consumer will occur as much as possible. This proposal will serve 80 consumers and 80 family members.</p>
