

# 1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Rick Wood (FA) called the meeting to order at 10:04 A.M.

#### 2. ESTABLISH QUORUM

A quorum was established.

## 3. WELCOME/INTRODUCTIONS

Members and others in attendance introduced themselves as indicated.

## 4. PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Harvey Lapin provided comment stating that the number of participants statewide is unsatisfactory. He advocated for focusing attention and resources on specific areas of the state and emphasizing the need for us to be prepared to roll out the program in June of 2021.

Ms. Constance Lapin thanked committee members for their work and urged them to take charge of the Self-Determination program. She requested that action be taken to implement the changes recommended in the SSDAC Report on Barriers to Implementation of Self-Determination and urged the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) to provide more oversight to regional centers.

Mr. Richard Dier provided comment on some of the barriers that his son has faced while participating in Self-Determination and expressed a desire to form an informal community support network in his area. He described the struggles in navigating the use of the sole employer model and asked that others who are navigating those issues contact him. He provided his contact information in the chat.

Ms. Cathy Gott, a vendor with the various regional centers spoke about her recent grant award with San Gabriel Pomona Regional Center. Her organization provides joint trainings and step-by-step assistance in a variety of modalities to meet the diverse needs of individuals with I/DD and their families. Ms. Gott stated that she believes there is a need for a universal container for all the program information and requested that the local advisory committees (LAC) dedicate a portion of their budget so that this can be made available as the statewide rollout is happening in June.

Ms. Sonni Charness, founder of Guidelight Group stated her concerns about the lack of guidelines and expectations provided by DDS and a lack of accountability for regional centers. Ms. Charness listed several barriers that have been encountered. She requested that the Department and regional centers correct these before the statewide rollout.

Ms. Christina Cannarella provided comment stating that her son's regional center has denied vendor services due to the level of care her son requires. She stated that her regional center has suffered a large number of dropouts from Self-Determination Program and requested consideration be given to allowing individuals on the waiting into the program.

Ms. Silvia Haro from North Los Angeles Regional Center provided comment about families wanting to use co-employer model being forced to hire private nurses because they have been unable to find an FMS willing to take on liability. She went on to request the contact information of any FMS who is servicing families under the co-employer model.

Ms. Sandra McElwee provided comment stating that she has been working with multiple program participants in various regional centers and has witnessed racial disparity and insufficient services. She stated there is a lack of information being made available to families and ongoing issues with the budget process. She requested that a reporting mechanism be made available to report such issues.

## 5. APPROVAL OF THE JUNE 2020 MEETING MINUTES

<u>It was moved/seconded (Landry/Cooley) and carried to approve the</u> <u>June 9, 2020 meeting minutes as presented</u>. (Motion passed unanimously by acclamation [see page 1 for a list of voting members]).

# 6. CO-CHAIR REPORT TO SSDAC

Co-hair Rick Wood gave an update on the activities that have taken place since the June 9<sup>th</sup> meeting. His report included the work done to distribute the Committee's barrier report and the outcome of the subsequent meetings that took place following the distribution of the report.

Co-Chair Wood also reported that he had attended a number of local advisory committee (LAC) meetings and offered his support to any LAC that invited him or Co-Chair Marquez to attend a meeting.

Co-Chair Wood concluded his report by reminding members that funds are needed from LACs if they want the SSDAC to meet more frequently.

# 7. LOCAL SDAC REPORTS

Members reported updates to their participant data and shared details of their budgets and local committee concerns. During these reports, members suggested taking regional center budget size into consideration when requesting funds for SSDAC meetings in the future.

Some barriers that were reported during the updates included the need the need for language interpreters during online platform meetings and vacancies in some of the LACs. Committee member Karen Millender reported that regional center clients in her area are experiencing individuals being forced to be left with services that do not meet their needs, thus resulting in clients leaving Self-Determination. She stated that she believes this to be an attempt for the regional center to stay cost neutral.

## 8. SSDAC REPORT ON BARRIERS TO IMPLEMENTING THE SELF-DETERMINATION PROGRAM – Next Steps

Ms. Maricris Acon and Mr. Tim Travis from DDS thanked members for their report and discussed steps taken to understand the barriers and how to address them. They announced that they are working with San Diego Regional Center to assist with a request for quote to find an agent that will provide technical assistance to providers on how they can provide an alternative services model. Other updates included responses received in the voluntary withdrawal survey.

Following the report from DDS, Co-Chair Wood presented an overview of the four main barriers identified in the barriers report and asked members for recommendations on the next steps to overcome them.

Members stated they required a number of things, including access to more data and anecdotes before making recommendations. Members also discussed establishing benchmarks for regional centers instead of waiting on the regional centers to develop them and LAC possibly redoing the orientation to be shorter in plain language. Members then requested that a workgroup work on some of these activities. Co-Chair Wood stated he would work with Co-Chair Maria Marquez and SCDD staff to identify volunteers for the workgroup that SCDD will convene.

#### 9. NEXT MEETING

The next meeting date is anticipated to take place in February 2021. If resources become available before then to conduct a meeting, the Co-Chairs will notify members.
