1. CALL TO ORDER

6. APPROVAL OF MARCH 22, 2021 MINUTES

Members reviewed the minutes from the March 22nd meeting. The minutes can be found starting on page 7 of the May SAAC packet.

7. REVIEW OF COUNCIL BUSINESS

SCDD Executive Director Aaron Carruthers reviewed Council Business with the Committee in preparation for the upcoming Council meeting. Executive Director Carruthers provided committee members with an update on the proposed 2021—2022 SCDD Budget and answered questions related to the budget process. Executive Director Carruthers also reviewed the proposed 2021—2022 Legislative Priorities and Positions with the committee.

8. SAAC RECOMMENDATIONS ON COUNCIL BUSINESS

Following discussion, SAAC members chose not to make any recommendations to the Council regarding Council Business

9. SAAC FEEDBACK ON SCDD TELL YOUR STORY SURVEY

SAAC members provided feedback on the "SCDD Tell Your Story Survey". The survey is intended to provide an opportunity for the public (self-advocates, family advocates, professionals and community members) to share how a Council activity or service made a difference in their lives. SAAC members recommended defining what a family advocate was, as family dynamics and interactions can be different depending on the relationship. Members also expressed an interest in having more inclusive options when asking about gender identity such as nonbinary, transgender and/or LBGTQ+.

10. COVID—19 HESITANCY DISCUSSION

SAAC members had an open discussion about vaccine hesitancy. Members talked about trust issues due to historical mistreatment of people with developmental disabilities by the medical profession, feeling overwhelm due to the amount of information and/or myths that exists about the vaccines, the lack of information available in plain language, and difficulty finding appointments due to internet access and transportation issues.

11. MEMBER UPDATES

Members provided updates and talked about issues and concerns from their communities. Updates included collaborating with Easter Seals to provide a webinar on the topic of mental health, staying connected with family and friends, being a supportive resource for information, contributing to the vaccination efforts of youth with disabilities, and collaborating on the rollout of Self-Determination Program in California.

Members expressed an interest in working on projects to address bullying and continuing to collaborate with local and statewide partners to distribute resources in their communities.

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) was signed into law by President George H.W. Bush on July 26, 1990. The ADA is a civil rights law that prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities in all areas of public life: in the workplace, at school, public transportation and public and private places that are open to the general public. Since the enactment of the ADA, California and the USA have seen both legislative and social change regarding accessibility, but there is still room for improvement.

In preparation for this discussion, SAAC members are encouraged to think about the following questions:

- What does the ADA mean to you?
- How has your life changed since the passage of the ADA?
- Are there any areas that still have access barriers that the State Council on Developmental Disabilities should be working to address?

Update on Developmental Center Closures

The State Council on Developmental Disabilities (SCDD) has interagency agreements with the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) in order to serve people with developmental disabilities throughout California. Since 1997 SCDD has provided Volunteer Advocacy Services (VAS) in all DDS state-operated facilities in order to provide advocacy resources to individuals that may not have family support.

Since 1999, SCDD has also provided <u>Clients Rights Advocate (CRA)</u> services to clients residing at DDS state-operated facilities.

SCDD staff within the CRA/VAS Project oversee the closure of developmental centers and help with the transition to community living. CRA/VAS Manager, Holly Bins will update SAAC on CRA/VAS progress throughout California.





Recent Activity: The Statewide Self-Advocacy Network (SSAN) held their second meeting of 2021 on June 9th & 10th, 2021 using Zoom.

Focus of Meeting:

Due to ongoing COVID—19 concerns, the June 2021 SSAN meeting was held over two days using Zoom. SSAN opened Day 1 of the meeting with a discussion on social justice by sharing their thoughts on different issues and sharing their stories.

SCDD Executive Director Aaron Carruthers provided SSAN members with an update on SCDD activity since the March SSAN meeting. Executive Director Carruthers talked about SCDD's continued efforts to address vaccine hesitancy among Californians with I/DD and their communities by providing timely, up to date and easy to understand information about the different types of COVID—19 vaccines. Executive Director Carruthers provided SSAN with an update on California's Budget and SCDD's efforts to distribute emergency preparedness kits or "GO Kits" to Californian's with I/DD and provide them with emergency preparedness training.

Members of the <u>SCDD Disability Advisory Committee (DAC)</u> provided SSAN with an overview of DAC, and their efforts to promote inclusion and accessibility within SCDD. The SCDD DAC is interested in developing a series of training videos for current and future SCDD employees and would like to collaborate with SSAN on the project.

Rick Wood, Co-Chair of the <u>Statewide Self-Determination Advisory Committee</u> provided SSAN with an update on California's Self-Determination Rollout. Starting July 2021, Self-Determination will be an option for all Regional Center Clients who are interested. Contact your regional center for more information.

On Day 2 of the SSAN meeting, members discussed their hopes and dreams for SSAN. Self-Advocates for Emergency Education (Project SAFEE) presented on addressing vaccine hesitancy among people with I/DD. SCDD Communications Manager, Lea Park-Kim, provided members with an overview of the legislative process and the role that advocacy has in the process. Stories from advocates help legislators understand the impact an issue has on individuals and their communities.
