1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Wesley Witherspoon (SA) called the meeting to order at 10:38 a.m.

2. ESTABLISH QUORUM

A quorum was established.

- 3. WELCOME/INTRODUCTIONS Members and others introduced themselves.
- 4. PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

5. APPROVAL OF THE JULY 2021 MEETING MINUTES

It was moved/seconded (Isaacs/Wavrin) and carried to approve the June 6, 2022, meeting minutes with an amendment to add the six target priorities under Number 9 on Page 10. (Steve Ruder, Christine Moody, and Larry Yin

abstained. All remaining members present voted in favor. See Page 1 for members in attendance.)

6. CHAIR UPDATE

Chair Witherspoon briefly updated the committee on relevant activities since the last meeting. The update included the DDS Employment Workgroup meeting on June 27th and SCDD's efforts to ensure the successful implementation of SB 639.

7. 2022 TARGETED PRIORITY UPDATES

Chair Witherspoon stated that the meeting will focus on three of the six targeted priority areas that were decided upon in the last meeting implementation of SB 639, data, and preventing people from "falling through the cracks." Tania Morawiec updated the group on SB 639 implementation efforts. SCDD is working with stakeholders and providing opportunities for input across the state to reach the goal of phasing-out subminimum wage by 2025. Community Conversations were held in each region to engage stakeholders and gather ideas, thoughts, and concerns about the phase-out. Information from the Conversations is available on SCDD's SB 639 webpage (<u>https://scdd.ca.gov/sb639-home/</u>).

The committee discussed collecting data to measure the success of the phase-out of subminimum wage, noting that both quantitative and qualitative data will need to be collected in order to fully understand the impact of SB 639. As a result of this conversation, the Committee agreed to reestablish its Data Workgroup.

8. TARGETED PRIORITY PRESENTATION

Michele Jodock, founder of <u>Vantage Point</u>, provided a presentation on her company's customized employment services. Vantage Point is a provider in San Diego and Orange County. In two years, they have helped over 250 individuals secure customized employment in the community. Vantage Point serves a range of people with disabilities, including those with I/DD, cognitive impairments, neurodiversity, hearing impairments, vision impairments, psychiatric or mental health conditions, physical disabilities, and "invisible" disabilities.

9. UPDATES ON CIE-RELATED LEGISLATION

Deputy Director of Policy and Public Affairs, Bridget Kolakosky gave a report on the legislative priorities for 2022. AB 2427 and AB 1831 have

stopped moving. The bills below have moved to the Appropriations Committee:

- AB 1663
- SB 951
- SB 870

The Legislative session ends on August 31st. Any bills that are passed must be signed within 30 days.

10. 2022 EMPLOYMENT FIRST REPORT

In preparation for the upcoming 2022 report, the Committee evaluated the contents and layout of the 2021 report.

11. UPDATE ON CIE BLUEPRINT IMPLEMENTATION

Committee member Michael Luna provided an update on the implementation of the CIE Blueprint. The report for years 3 and 4 is in final stages of draft review. The Blueprint Team accomplished their goal of meeting with all 59 LPAs (Local Partnership Agreement). LPAs have established and improved communications between partners. The Blueprint team will ultimately update the CaIHSS website with resources created by the LPAs.

12. DDS UPDATES

Committee Member Michael Luna provided an update on the Department of Developmental Services CIE related activities. Business Use Case Proposal data is currently being shared between DOR and DDS and will be shared with the committee after it has been analyzed. Rate setting implementation went into effect on April 1, 2022, raising rates for supported employment and individual and group placements.

Guidelines for DDS's \$10 million grant opportunities were released on June 30th. Applications are due on August 24, 2022. Grant guidelines, FAQs, and video from the vendors conference are posted on the <u>Employment Grants</u> website.

DDS received funding (due to SB 188) for a three-year pilot focusing on CIE for those with I/DD who are exiting work activity programs and secondary education. SB 188 also allows tailored-day services to be chosen in conjunction with other services (such as supported employment). This was not allowed under previous rules. A new rate will need to be developed.

13. MEMBERS UPDATES

Chair Witherspoon asked that the October agenda include a consumer advocate who is concerned about employment at the regional center.

Committee member Sarah Isaacs stated DOR is in process of providing updates to the California Code of Regulations so people will better understand their rights, especially with regard to higher education and career advancement.

Committee member Nick Wavrin provided CDE updates. The IEP Template Workgroup and the Alternative Pathway to High School Diploma Workgroup have been reauthorized in the current budget. They will reconvene and deliver by 2024. Two Workability I Statewide Elementary School Connection Grants have been awarded to two school districts, San Jacinto USD and Elk Grove USD. It is a pilot grant to expand resources, tools, and professional development. In turn, this will build the capacity to connect secondary transition programs to students in elementary school. CDE has increased the number of Family Empowerment Centers from 14 to 41 Statewide. These Centers provide training and information to families of those aged 3 to 22.

14. FUTURE MEETINGS AND ADJOURNMENT

Upcoming meeting for 2022 are scheduled October 20th.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:14 p.m.

"Making CIE a Reality-Not Just a Goal" Presentation

Lucille Lynch and Tyler Hershey of Beacons have been invited to give an overview of the CIE program at Beacons, Inc. Beacons is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit founded in 2018 that provides vocational, recreational, and social activities as well as services to adults with developmental disabilities and their support teams to create pathways, accommodation planning, and measurable goals driven by the interests and skills of its trainees to improve access to employment and the community in general.

Lucile is currently President of the Board and a co-founder, as well as a parent of a Beacons trainee. She served as an education advocate, superintendent, and lawyer prior to Beacons. Tyler Hershey is the Director of the PathFinder vocational training division and works directly with trainees as an instructor as well as a job development and retention partner. Prior to Beacons, he worked in public education in Hawaii supporting individuals with diverse abilities. His dedication has resulted in 100% CIE for trainees in the recent PathFinder 2021 Fall and 2022 Spring sessions.


