




Statewide Enrollment

Self-Determination Program

DDS is working on:

- Updating current Directives and FAQs
 - Updated Spending Plan FAQs
 - Regional Center/Local Advisory Committee Remaining Pilot Funds
- Developing new guidance as needed
 - $\circ~$ Purchasing Goods and Services
 - Home and Community Based Settings Requirements
- State Council for Developmental Disabilities (SCDD) funding for the Statewide Self-Determination Advisory Committee (SSDAC)

Statewide Orientation

State Council for Developmental Disabilities (SCDD) will develop plain language materials and provide orientation in 2021-22

RCs will provide information about orientation

Future years: One or more contracts for materials and orientation.



Budget Act of 2021



Additional funds to Support SDP:

- Participant Choice Specialists
- Enhanced Transition Supports
- Statewide Orientation and related plain language materials
- Office of the Ombudsperson

Other Statutory Changes

- Department letter on October 19, 2021, provided an overview of July 2021 Trailer Bill Language
- Long-Term Sustainability
 - Individual budget and Spending Plan review
 - Individual budget also considers cost effectiveness of services, and documents reason for budget changes
 - Assist consumers and families with Medi-Cal enrollment
- Oversight and Accountability
 - Standards and certifications for FMS and Independent Facilitators
 - Training for RC Service Coordinators, Participant Choice Specialists and Fair Hearing Coordinators about SDP
 - Strengthen Local Volunteer Advisory Committee
- Performance Incentives Program
 - Develop SDP benchmarks and outcome in areas such as timely enrollment, diversity of consumers and reduction of disparities
- Increase Service Access and Equity and Reduce Disparities
 - RC develop SDP outreach plans to underserved communities
 - Report individual budget data similar to POS data

Current Person-Centered Planning & Transition Supports

Pre-transition supports include:

- Developing a Person-Centered Plan
- Assistance with IPP and individual budget and developing spending plan
- Locating services needed to implement your IPP
- Department guidance on <u>July 15, 2021</u>

Pre-transition supports provided by:

- Family and friends
- Up to \$2500 in funding from the regional center to hire someone to help you, such as an independent facilitator or an FMS
- Transition services and supports identified and/or funded by your Local Volunteer Advisory Committee
- Service Coordinator and Participant Choice Specialist

New Ways to Provide Person Center Planning & Transition Supports

Person-Centered Planning Services: Available to all consumers—in SDP and traditional system

Transition Supports: Available to all consumers moving to SDP

- Service Coordinator can still help support transition to SDP
- Consumer has option to select someone else to support transition
- Transition services must be eligible for federal matching funds
- Available without cost to the consumer
- Consumers choose the kinds of supports they need and who provides the supports

Enhanced Transition Supports

• The Budget Act 2021 provides funds for additional supports to help consumers and their families who need more help transitioning to SDP.

Feedback About Transition Supports & Enhanced Transition Services

Small Focus Group Recommendations:

- Make it easy for consumers and families to access transition supports
- Every consumer and family is different
 - Allow choice over transition supports that make sense
- Options for who can provide supports
 - Meet language and cultural needs
- Some consumers and families need more support than others
 - Allow flexibility to meet different needs
- Providing individual training for families who need additional time to understand SDP
