- Administration on Community Living (ACL) approved and praised CA's 2022 Program and Performance Report (PPR)
- PPR is annual report of the work done for our federal funding

- "The Council did a great job describing their overall efforts to address the needs of individuals with developmental disabilities and their families of a diverse culture through its State Plan supported activities."
- "The Council has a commitment to translating products in various languages including plain language."

- ACL named specific SCDD accomplishments:
 - Ongoing work with Tribal communities
 - Emergency preparedness
 - Trainings and resources in multiple languages
 - Mental health projects
 - Policy impacts, including conservatorship reform
 - Supporting self-advocacy groups

- SCDD has met almost all the 2023 workplan projected activities and numbers for each objective.
- Goal 1: Provided 22 SA-related trainings and supported 110 SA Group meetings
- Goal 2: Engaged in policy work, systems monitoring, systems change projects on the regional and statewide level, and professional capacity-building
- Goal 3: Provided 134 trainings, participated in 47 events

- After conducting a mid-year analysis, the State Plan Team has identified a gaps in workplan progress
- Information being shared with Regional Offices
- Strategically planning to meet all projected numbers by September 30th.

Advocacy to Phase Out Subminimum Wage

- Subminimum Wage Report (SCDD, 2023)
 - Testified in Assembly and Senate Budget Subcommittee hearings on the report, its recommendations, and priority for an Employment First Office
 - Department of Developmental Services, Department of Rehabilitation directors and Health and Human Services Agency also testified, committed to phasing out subminimum wage, and committed to phase out by January 2025.
- Councilmember Michael Ellis met with Assembly Budget Subcommittee Chair Juan Arambula for 45 minutes on a wide range of topics, including the Council's priority for an Employment First Office

Alternatives to Conservatorship

- Began a Community of Practice with the national Center on Youth Voice Youth Choice
 - Promote alternatives to conservatorship for youth
- Supported Decision Making Technical Advisory Program \$5 million
 - Hiring staff
 - Developing guidelines

Promoting the Community's Voice Internationally

- SCDD conducted a contest, "There Should Be a Law," 100 voices
- UCLA took data and turned it into an academic analysis
- Analysis accepted by International Society for Autism Research
- UCLA presented in Stockholm
