# **RAC Topic Areas for Exploration in 2024**

Think about what types of systems change and capacity-building work. Think about projects/polices/legislation implementation that impact the broader region—that impact multiple counties.

### Potential Project Ideas from the November 2023 RAC Meeting:

- Involvement and advocacy for our community with intersectional advocacy (race/ ethnicity, language, LGBTQIA+, disability) collaborations, impacting community safety, street safety, and/or systems navigation.
- Collaborate with the San Mateo Commission on Disabilities on the Statewide Caregiver Abuse Registry (for CA adults looking for caregivers). This group has collected data and info about related policy efforts, including the current central index (CACI) overseen by DOJ. Advocates say the current system is inadequate, and a new system needs to be developed, cross-system (because workers move between systems).
- Involvement and advocacy for our community with Social and Recreational Programming. This kind of programming needs to expand—more options, more flexibility, person-centered, and more accessible programming.
   Regional Centers have received a directive from DDS to update their policies on Social and Rec services.
- Supported Decision Making (SDM) Technical Assistance Program
   education and outreach in the Bay Area, to ensure people with IDD and
   other disabilities have access to SDM and have their SDM respected in
   education, IDD services, healthcare, financial institutions, and legal /

- Involvement and advocacy for our community with the Association of Bay Area Governments: Part regional planning agency and part local gov't service provider to build cooperation and collaboration across local governments and communities. https://abag.ca.gov/

  Finance Authority: A first-of-its-kind regional authority created to address
  the Bay Area's chronic housing challenges. In the last year they have held
  the workshops as part of its public information effort around a potential
