#### Summary of Enacted Budget

- Largely similar to May Revise
  - \$11.8 billion shortfall (not \$16 billion), solved by a mix of spending cuts, borrowing, raising revenue, and moving money around

Many of the proposed cuts to IHSS were not made

•Increased managed care taxes and provider payments


